

PUBLIC NOTICE

Canadian Navigable Waters Act

Omni Marine Services Inc. (Omni)/Ocean Choice International hereby gives notice that an application has been made to the Minister of Transport, pursuant to the *Canadian Navigable Waters Act* for approval of the work described herein and its site and plans.

Pursuant to paragraph 7(2) of the said Act, Omni has deposited with the Minister of Transport, on the on-line Navigable Waters Registry (<http://cps.canada.ca/>) and under registry number 3621 or, under the NPP File Number 2019-200018 a description of the following work, its site and plans:

Construction of a finger pier and infilling of waterlot property acquired by Omni in the Port of Long Pond (previous Transport Canada Port), in the Town of Conception Bay South, NL. The general site location is east of Terminal Road having approximately coordinates of 47°51'45.60"N, 52°97'61.35"W. The project is located on the southwest portion of the Port (east of Terminal Road) and consists of the following:

- Construction of a finger Pier measuring 90m (L) x 9m (W) that will be constructed on land, floated into position and rock ballasted over a dredged area approximately of 7380m². The wharf will be completed with a reinforced concrete deck.
- Construction of infill uplands area with an approximate footprint of 16870m², consisting of clean rock and gravel fill, topped with Class "B" and Class "A" granulars, and asphalt pavement. The outer perimeter of infill will be composed of rip rap which will be sloped to provide stability. Construction of potential infill uplands area with an approximate footprint of 10294m², consisting of clean rock and gravel fill, topped with Class "B" and Class "A".
- The toe of the dredge slope will be 30m offset either side of the finger pier wharf to achieve minus 9m of water berthing on low tide.
